



EXPLORE THE ARTS AND CRAFTS REVIVAL IN ULSTER

The Accredited Ballycastle Museum is housed in the town's 18th century courthouse and market building. Visitors can explore the fascinating history of the Irish Homes Industries Workshop and the important role it played in the Arts and Crafts Revival in Ulster. Highlights on display include the Liscolman pot - an early Bronze Age food vessel, glass and a tram axel associated with Boyd's 18th century industries and the magnificent Taise Banner from the first Feis na nGleann in 1904.

THE KING OF BALLYCASTLE

The King of Ballycastle project will use 3D scanning and printing technology to investigate an extraordinary, but little known, part of Ballycastle's history – an enigmatic royal figure carved over 2000 years ago which once looked over Ballycastle harbour.

Together with the Friends of Ballycastle Museum, Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council Museum Services will run a number of events and workshops exploring and celebrating these ancient statues and their place in Ballycastle.

Ballymoney Museum is part of the Ballymoney Town Hall and offers visitors the opportunity to explore the vibrant history of the area with a particular focus on local motorcycle road racing heroes. The permanent Accredited Museum also explores the story of the area since early times through its Victorian Collection which includes the enigmatic Derrykeighan Stone from which the museum takes its logo. Visitors can also research local and family histories in the resource area.

IMAGINE, REMAKE, REPLAY PHOTOGRAPHY EXHIBITION

As part of the Reimagine Remake Replay project, a free 6 week photography course was offered for 16-25 year olds. Using Ballymoney museum's unique collection as inspiration, participants used modern photographic techniques to create the photographs on display within our new window display system.



GEORGE SHIELS - A DISTINGUISHED IRISH PLAYWRIGHT

Ballymoney's playwright George Shiels (1881-1949) was one of the most popular Irish playwrights of the early twentieth century. He achieved great success writing for the Abbey Theatre, Dublin where



in 1940, one of his most famous works, The Rugged Path, was seen by a record 40,000 people over a 3 month period. This exhibition sets out to celebrate the life of this local playwright and dramatist, and to commemorate the 70th anniversary of his death. The exhibition will include objects from the recently acquired Alex Blair Collection, the University of Ulster Collection as well as the original George Shiels portrait painted by Jack Wilkinson from the Abbey Theatre Dublin.

Coleraine Town Hall, built in 1859, is Coleraine Museum's accredited exhibition venue. Coleraine Museum at Coleraine Town Hall is open for over 6 months of the year. Here, visitors can begin to explore 'Irish History Starts Here' with its story of Mountsandel – the first settlement in Ireland nearly 10,000 years ago, and the history of Coleraine as the first Planted town 400 years ago. With an extensive collection supporting a rich and important history, different themes from the collection are explored through a range of temporary exhibitions. In the absence of a permanent museum venue for visitors, an appointment can be made with Museum Services to explore other parts of the collection. The iconic listed building in the town centre also houses the Visitor Information Centre and other community cultural events.

Sam Henry, born in Coleraine in 1878, is best known as a Folklorist and recognised for his 'Songs of the People' series that ran in the

Northern Constitution newspaper. Sam's ability to connect with all sorts of people has created a fascinating and insightful archive that stretches far beyond his song collection. It captures people and places in the Causeway Coast and Glens area and beyond.

Explore more of Sam's collection through this exhibition and discover the work that local community groups, from across the Borough, have been inspired to create through hands on access to the archive.

This exhibition features a collection of Chinese watercolours by artist, Rong-Gen Yin. Originally from Shanghai, Rong-Gen now lives in Northern Ireland. Rong-Gen's work embraces the two main techniques of Chinese painting – Gongbi, where intricate brushstrokes form detailed coloured landscapes, which can include narrative themes and Xieyi, which is much looser using bold brushstrokes and watercolour wash.



EMBRACING HUMAN RIGHTS CONFLICT TEXTILES' JOURNEY

This exhibition connects to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (1948) and addresses two key questions:

1. What is the impact of, and response to, human rights violations?

2. How can we embed a culture of human rights?

The programme marks more than 10 years of Conflict Textiles exhibitions and associated activities in a variety of local and international venues. Conflict and human rights abuses, explored through the tactile medium of textiles have remained a central theme in all of these events.

The collaboration with Council Museum Services and Roe Valley Arts and Cultural Centre has its roots in previous collaborations with the Museum Service and Conflict Textiles since 2011.




