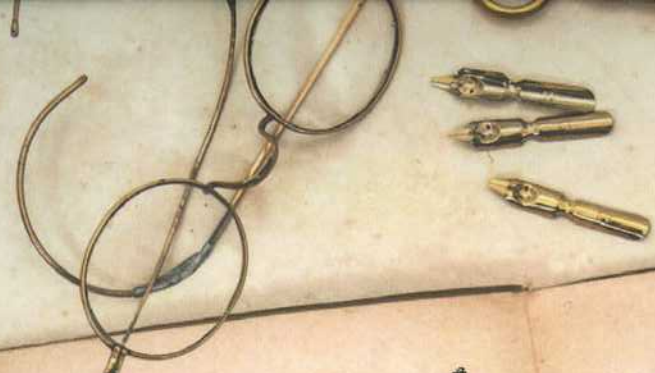



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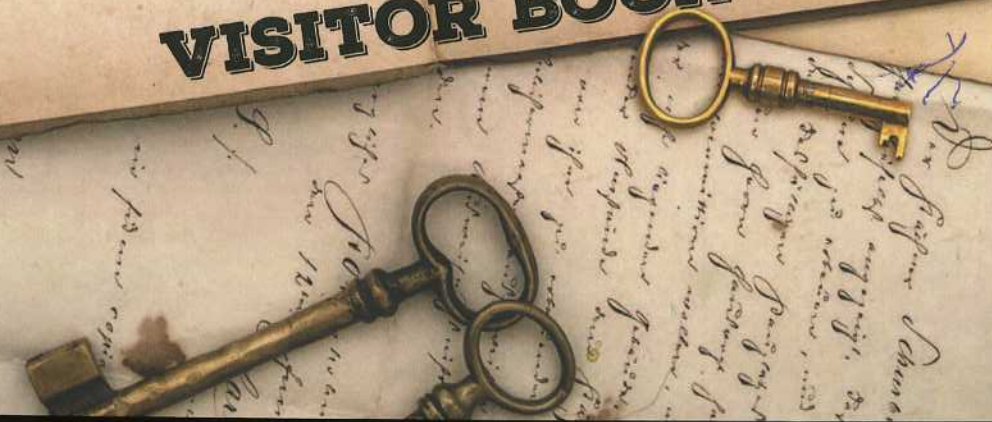

in the now demolished Rockcastle just before the
strand is now replaced by gated apartments, when
I was a student at the unfortunately named "New
University of Ulster" - implying it wouldn't last. We
abandoned Rockcastle long ago year in the hatted
towns with a window seat all the way round in a circle,
& then next year in the original castle's kitchen which
by dint of that had inside windows to the
pantry... We walked the convent walk daily,
reposed on seats along the wild flowered cliffs
& daring to go on the diving board of the now peck
& beautifully restored Port St. Mary's house. I did
all my Woodworth revision for finals in the suntrap
in front of the fishery hut, lying in the angle between
the sea harbor and the wall. Every Sunday we
walked with whatever pals we'd invited to Sunday
dinner to the Bannagh & back whatever the weather.
There were inevitable barbecues in the sandhills,
& too, kisses... Now having had to leave for work
14 years after graduating (1976) I am back with my
husband in retirement with arthritis, but enjoying bits of
walks along the strand & the views from the point & at the
Hesmy point. I love you Port Stewart & love you Walshe. Thank you!
