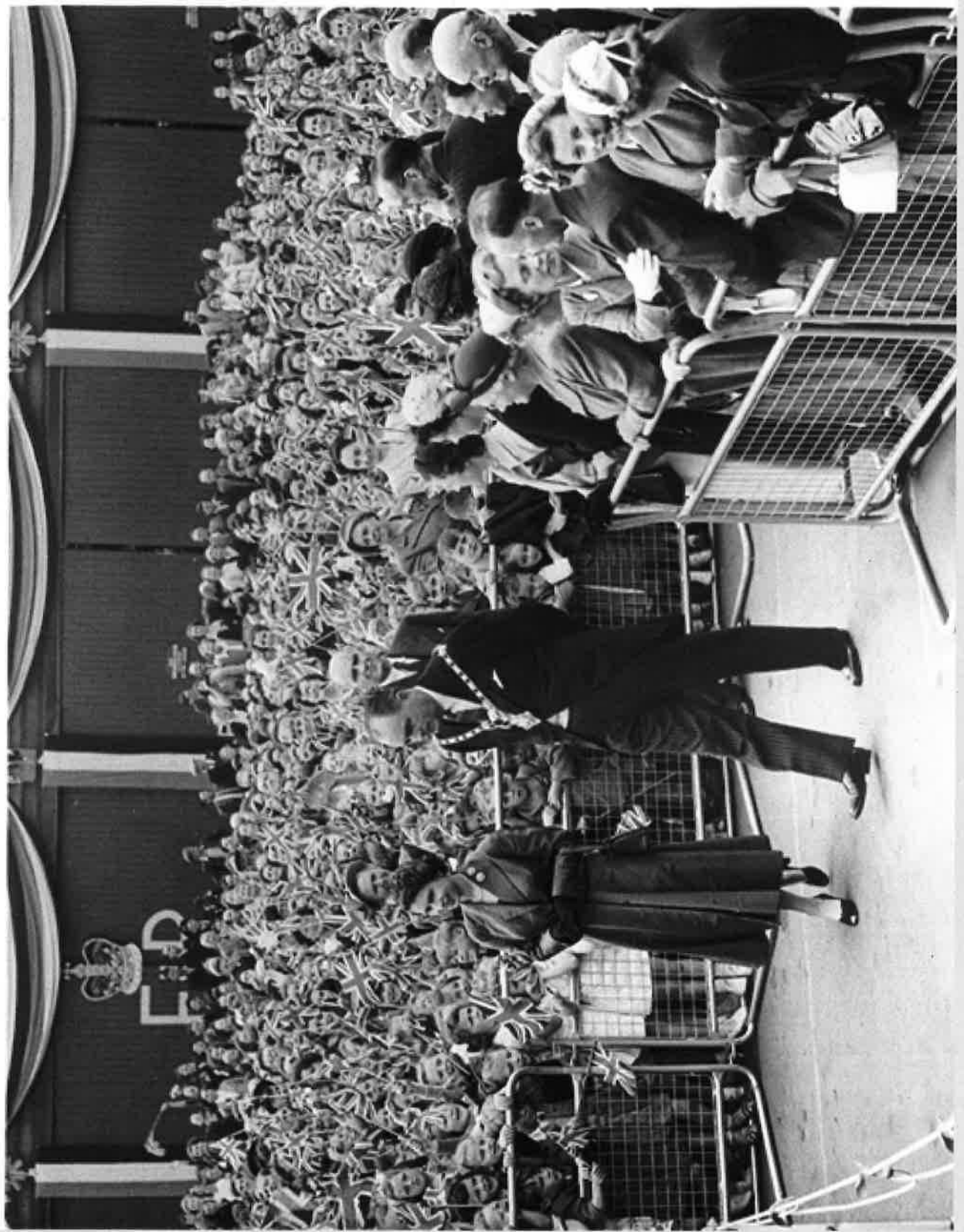

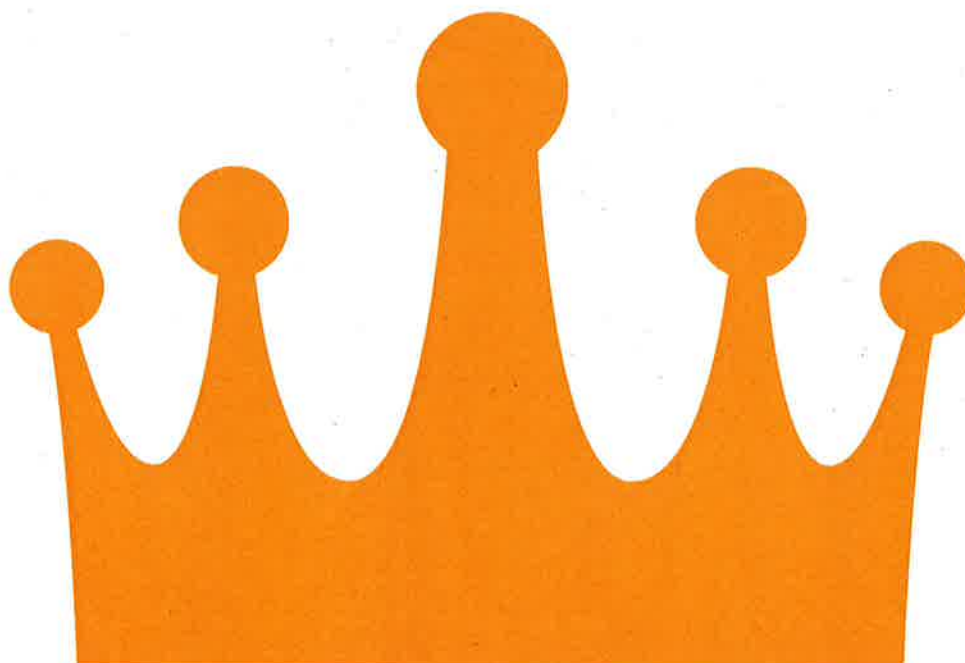

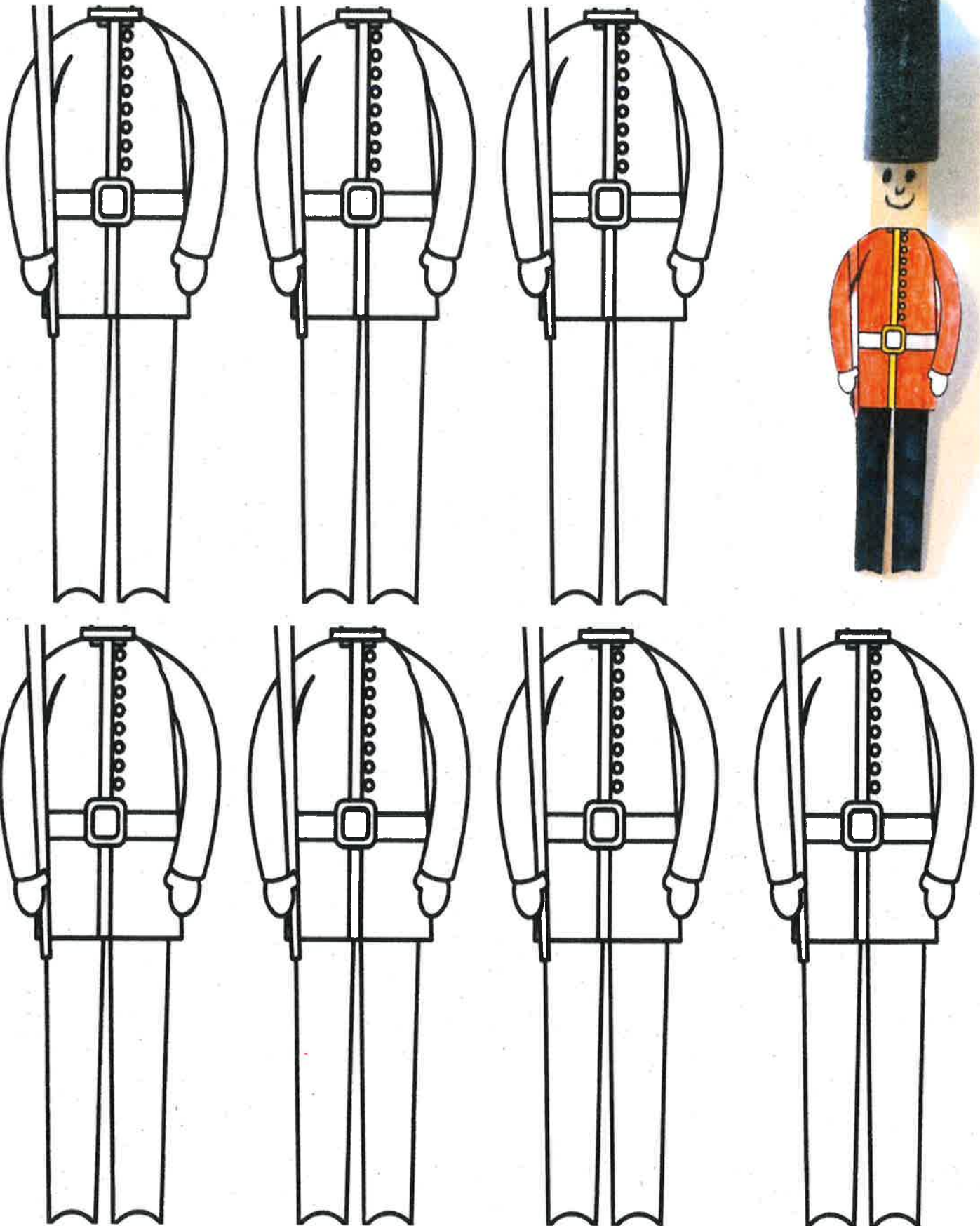

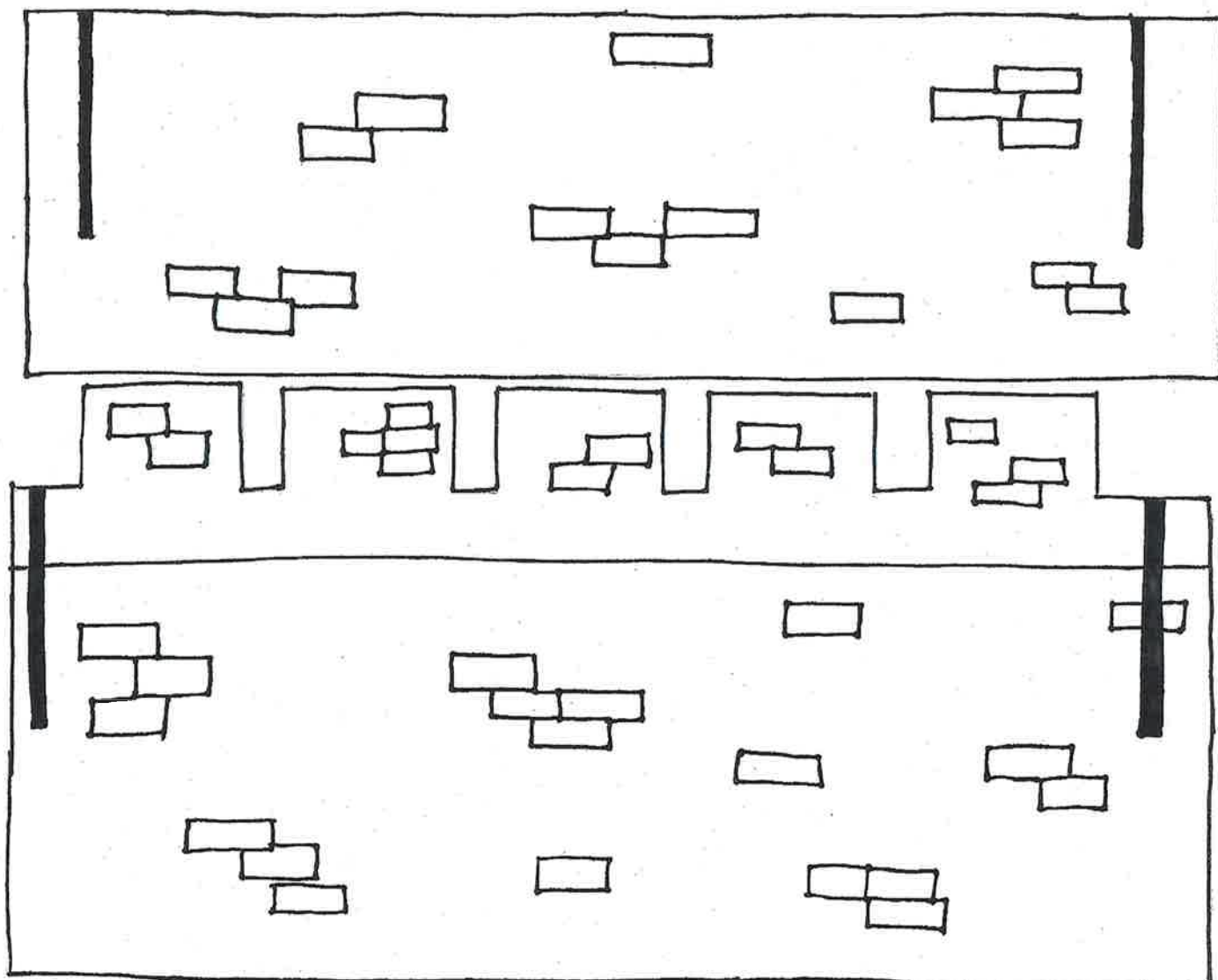
The Queen's Guards.

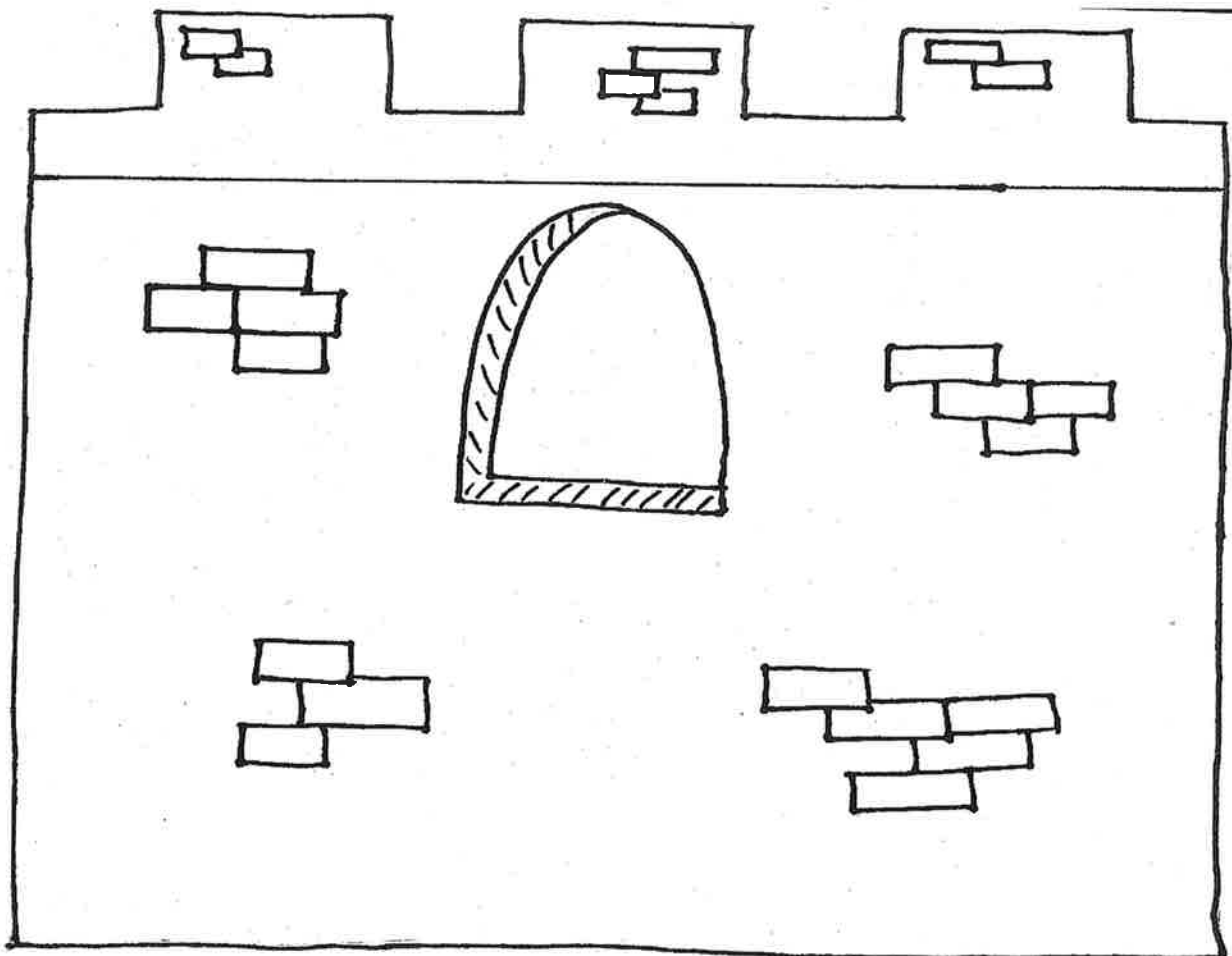
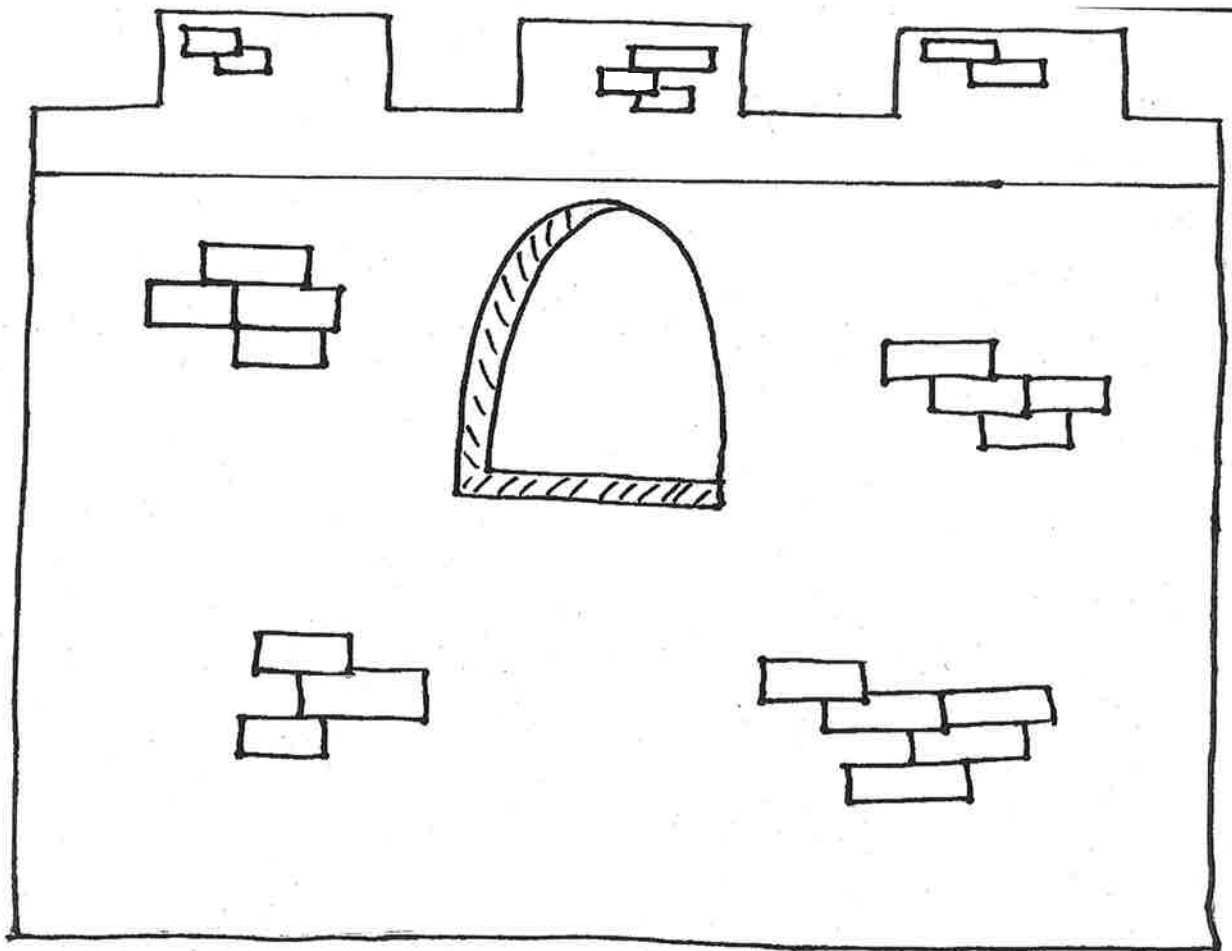
Colour in the templates, cut out and stick to a lollipop stick. Draw on a face and then use black foam, felt or card to create the tall fur cap known as a bearskin.



Castle template.

Print 2 of each template, colour in and cut out. Cut along the thick black lines to create slits and cut a doorway in one of the battlement sides. Glue the turret templates around cardboard tubes and cut 2 slits at the bottom of each tube to slot the walls into.





The Queen's Corgi.

Colour in the template pieces below, cut out and stick onto a paper plate, drawing in the corgi's mouth. and then stick on googly eyes. You can attached a lollipop stick at the back to create a mask.

The Queen has had more than 30 Corgi's since she became Queen in 1952 and has given them names such as Disco, Brush, Windsor, Monty, and Spark.
